Volunteering FAQs

Q: What are the prerequisites for becoming a volunteer driver?

A: Driver must be 18 years and older; must submit valid driver's license and auto insurance; successfully complete and pass a criminal background check; and willingness to use own vehicle to deliver meals to assigned addresses.

Q: Is there currently a need for volunteer delivery drivers?

A: Yes! It takes hundreds of volunteers each day to deliver meals. Many seniors are often dependent on the food and safety checks our volunteers provide.

Q: How much time does it take to deliver meals?

A: Every route is different, and clients change over time. Meals typically take about 1.5 to 2 hours to deliver, depending on the length of the route.

Q: Where are the meals made?

A: Meals are prepared at 3 designated locations: Gibson Center for Senior Services, Ossipee Concerned Citizens and Wolfeboro Area Meals on Wheels and are distributed to various towns all over Carroll County, New Hampshire by our dedicated Meals on Wheels drivers.

Volunteering FAQs

Q: Can RSVP help out with gas?

A: RSVP reimburses for mileage from your home to the Meals on Wheels site and from your last delivered meal location back to your home. Mileage reimbursement is based on a cost-permile rate, with a monthly maximum of 200 miles. Volunteers are reimbursed within the limits of available funds each quarter.





Q: When would I volunteer?

A: Hot meals are delivered anytime between 10:00AM and Noon five days/week. Generally, volunteers pick up meals around 9:45AM at one of the six Meals on Wheels locations.

Q: Where do I pick up the meals?

A: Gibson Center for Senior Services,
Wolfeboro Area Meals on Wheels,
Moultonboro-Sandwich Meals Program,
Ossipee Concerned Citizens, Tamworth
Community Nurse Association, or Greater
Wakefield Resource Center.

Volunteering FAQs

Q: What kind of folks are best suited to be volunteers for Meals On Wheels?

A: Anyone who is compassionate about Carroll County seniors should consider volunteering. Volunteers are those individuals who are available weekdays (except holidays) between 9:30 AM and noon.

Q: What if I can't deliver meals on certain days?

A: Each of the six Meals on Wheels Programs work with their volunteer drivers and their schedules directly and can always be contacted.
